fully updated and expanded for the second edition this core textbook provides rigorous coverage of the key themes and debates at the cutting edge of sociolinguistics research and brings together many of the most influential scholars in the field comprising six distinctive parts and almost fifty individual chapters it introduces students to a wealth of issues in sociolinguistics including refashioning linguistic identities code switching language rights and the social functions of small talk chapters are richly illustrated with examples and informed by the latest scholarly debates this is an essential companion for all undergraduates and postgraduates involved in the study of sociolinguistics it will

be an ideal resource for lecturers teaching modules on topics such as language variation language and gender language attitudes and multilingualism

although in czechoslovakia sociolinguistics is not institutionalized some results and approaches of czech linguistics appear to be sociolinguistic and that from the viewpoint of other linguistic and scientific traditions in general the socio component of czech linguistics took shape as early as between the two world wars in the activity of the prague linguistic school and is influenced in a positive way also by a contemporary philosophico ideological climate the contents of the present volume include contributions of prominent czech linguists especially research workers from academic and university institutions the papers concentrate on four general subjects 1 methodological problems 2 the theory of standard language and language culture 3 presentation of the linguistic situation in czechoslovakia 4 communication in small social groups all papers are written in english the volume is primarily intended for those concerned with general linguistics sociolinguistics slavonic studies and czech studies

in the first volume of this kind for years the editors have assembled a definitive view of the discipline bringing together much original work in sociolinguistics ranging from fundamental theoretical statements and methodological articles to classic explorations in dialect and style variation language attitudes and stereotyping multilingualism face to face interaction and ethnography of communication the contributors are eminent sociolinguists acclaimed internationally as pioneers and leading authorities in the field this major new textbook will be a unique and invaluable resource for students and teachers of sociolinguistics and neighbouring disciplines

book is articulated through a series of propositions accompanied by annotations and commentaries that develop qualify and exemplify these propositions as for the research questions that would be central to a cognitive sociolinguistic endeavor the following incomplete catalog could be enumerated what do speakers know about their language what do they know about communicative interaction what do speakers know about sociolinguistic variation where does that knowledge reside and how is it configured how does social reality influence the origin and processing of language how does language use affect the configuration evolution and variation of language what do speakers know about their socio communicative context how do speakers perceive sociolinguistic reality what are speakers attitudes and beliefs regarding linguistic variation how does sociolinguistic perception influence speakers communicative behavior at all levels how does language contribute to the construction of identity offering a fresh perspective on the frequently taught and studied topic of cognitive linguistics a framework for cognitive sociolinguistics can easily be incorporated into existing courses in the areas of both cognitive and sociocultural linguistics

sociophonetics is one of the sub branches of the discipline that has attracted a great deal of attention over the last decade recent advances in speech science and their technological simulations allow increasingly sophisticated studies of the progress of language contact and change these studies particularly those at the level of pronunciation show that language variety is robust and socially embedded in interesting ways instrumental studies of language variety contact and change have focused on the role of social categories and attitudes in variety perception as well as production some of the studies presented in this volume look at the specific role of social factors in the formation progress and deterrence of intralingual contact and change while others look at the ways in which social identities and beliefs influence a listener s ability to identify and comprehend varieties these studies use detailed acoustic analyses of production speech data and of responses to samples of data based on such analyses although the book assumes some knowledge of basic acoustics and variationist studies the general introduction provides a review of practices in the field including those of collection analysis and interpretation
